

## Social Sciences Department

The Social Sciences department was formed in 2004. The popularity of Sociology, Psychology and more recently Politics at St. Joseph's College is evident in the enthusiasm and determination of the students taking these subjects.

There are currently five Psychology, three Sociology, and two Politics teaching groups in the Sixth Form. In 2011 we successfully introduced Politics to the curriculum, and whilst the number of students is lower than the other two subjects, the commitment and drive of the students makes this a hugely important subject for us to deliver.

Each A level group receives ten hours of teaching over the course of a two week timetable. Teaching groups are normally shared by two teachers.

The department follows the AQA specification for all three subjects.
